Erasmus Generation calls for a more social exchange programme!

On the 14th of September, **the Erasmus Student Network has** <u>launched a petition</u> to European Commission and the European Parliament to create an Erasmus programme which **encourages social integration & intercultural awareness** through **volunteering and engaging with local communities** during an international exchange.

The petition is accompanied by the <u>SocialErasmus Charter</u> which examines the key elements that should form the backbone of an Erasmus experience. Additionally, the project features supporting measures for all involved actors, including **recognition of volunteering** activities in Higher Education Institutions. This will allow for the next Erasmus programme 2021-2027 to multiply the results of the investment in each participant and **support** the creation of a society of active citizens. The initiative is also rooted in large-scale research (ESNsurvey 2016, page 53) which proves that only one-third of international students developed a high number of local friendships as expected.

<u>SocialErasmus+</u> is a project coordinated by the Erasmus Student Network and co-funded by the European Commission.
